Chedoke Estate

The Chedoke Estate, also known as Balfour House, is one of the oldest heritage properties in the city. The manor house and grounds situated on the edge of the Mountain are almost hidden from view by the traffic passing by on Scenic Drive.

Few know that the estate is owned by the citizens of Ontario through the province's heritage agency, the Ontario Heritage Trust.

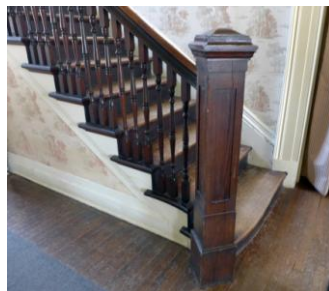
The oldest portion of the home was constructed of Mountain stone in 1836 for William Scott Burn. After passing through several owners, the estate was purchased in 1909 by William Southam, owner of the Hamilton Spectator, as a wedding gift to his only daughter Ethel and

her husband St. Clair Balfour II.

The Southam-Balfour family donated the property to the Trust in 1978 with the proviso that Ethel's daughter Wilson Baxter, who had been born in the home in 1915, remain as long as she wished. Wilson Baxter died in the home in 2013.

In May 2015 the estate was opened to the public for the first time as part of Doors Open and Museums Month. Visitors were able to walk the grounds, admire the view and tour the large empty rooms of the home.

The Hamilton Mountain Heritage Society has been in contact with the Trust and we hope to see the house remain accessible to the community as part of any future plans.



Remembering the Hamilton Psychiatric Hospital

On the grounds of the new Centre for Integrated Healthcare, between the parking lot and the Mountain brow, St. Joseph's Healthcare has incorporated remnants from the demolished buildings along with information panels explaining the history of the former buildings on the site. To see more artifacts about the evolution of the site from Asylum to Ontario Hospital to Hamilton Psychiatric Hospital, the Hamilton Museum of Mental Healthcare in the new hospital can be visited Monday to Friday from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.

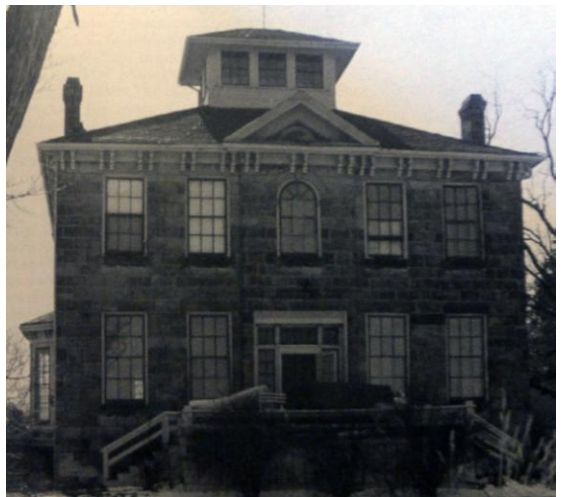
