Century Manor update

The City of Hamilton is considering the purchase of former hospital lands being sold by the Province of Ontario. The 21 acre parcel includes the Century Manor building which is designated under the Ontario Heritage Act.

The decision whether to purchase the property will be based on the outcome of a visioning process with the City, stakeholders and the community and financial analysis of a preferred land use concept. 
Upcoming Programme Dates
